EU LAW TRAINING IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE:  
BLENDED AND INTEGRATED CONTENT AND LANGUAGE TRAINING  
FOR EUROPEAN NOTARIES AND JUDGES



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On 27 and 28 January 2020 in Budapest (Hungary), at the Hungarian Chamber of Civil Law Notaries, the fourth seminar of the Project EuLawInEN was held on the subject of "Succession and Family law in practice".

Two notaries and two judges who were trained at the "Train of Trainers Course", held in Rome from 18 to 22 March, and who were already speakers during the seminar in Plovdiv (Bulgaria) and in Rome (Italy) in 2019, were also trainers at the fourth seminar in Budapest that reached over 60 participating legal professionals, among whom notaries and judges.

The methodology applied at the fourth seminar has been once more the C.L.I.L. (Content and Language Integrated Learning), thus granting EU law and English language learning. In comparison with the seminars held in 2019, the approach used during the 2020 seminar in Budapest was more practical than theoretical. In fact, the ToT experts dedicated more space to discuss several EU Court of Justice past and pending cases. The speakers addressed practical cases too, discussed them directly with the audience, also integrating the theoretical part, even if only briefly, whenever it was necessary to explain the cases. Best practices exchanges were also undertaken in a rather informal and informative manner.

A new serious practical game elaborated by Professor Ioriatti was introduced at the start of the training event as ice-breaking activity contributing to create a favorable environment for later discussion of practical cases and best practices. The same workshop already tested during the seminar in Plovdiv in 2019 was delivered during the fourth seminar too, in order to test the workshop with a different audience. Groups composed of notaries and judges worked together for more than one hour on EU Regulations application to various scenarios and few solutions to the identified cases were also proposed and analyzed in some detail.

Finally, one simulation with one case of the e-learning serious game was presented for the second time towards the end of the seminar and the audience had the possibility to test it in real time by accessing the game from their mobile devices together with the ToT experts and the speakers.

The next two seminars in 2020 will be held respectively in Sofia (Bulgaria), on 27 and 28 April, and in Rome (Italy) (dates to be defined).

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
