GoinEu Obiectives


General Objective:

contribute to correct and coherent application of Successions Regulation through analytical and capacity building activities targeting legal practitioners.

Specific Objectives:

- analyze the impact of Successions Regulation in its first years of application with regard to: (i) migrant families; (ii) family models with different degrees of recognition in Member States; (iii) relationships with the new Family Regulations; (iv) successions interested by alien contractual schemes; (v) status filiations constituted abroad through a.r.t.; (vi) inheritance of digital goods;
- 2. capacitate legal practitioners to correctly apply the Regulation.





Among all activities Seminars, Elearning and studies collected in the Final Volume achieved the goal of Goineu projects:
